Questionnaires are a great way of collecting data and getting feedback from your website visitors. You don't have to use a template, software or online survey creators to have one. You can simply create it in HTML code and style it with CSS to match your current Website Design. This article will introduce the most common question types which will allow you a great flexibility when designing your questionnaire.

Programming

Using HTML/CSS, you need to generate a static web page (which does not respond to actions) which is a survey of the user interface of a website of your choice. You decide for yourself which questions to ask.

Basic requirements of your page (Compulsory)

Your page should be minimally "pleasant to look at" and have some consistency (coherence). We will see throughout the semester different design principles, so this is only a firststep. Your page should contain:

- A title
- A link to the website
- An image of the page (IU to be evaluated) that also serves as a link to the website.
- A form containing at least 6 questions related to the evaluation of the Website:
 - A text-type question
 - Two single choice questions (radio button and a list)
 - A selection question (several boxes can be selected)
 - A space to write down comments.
- A button to submit the questionnaire.
- Your signature (*Website designed by ...*) at the bottom of the page.
- The use of `<div>` tags to make the questions uniform.
- Using external CSS (separate file) to set styles for titles, divisions, your signature at the bottom of the page. Explore font, color, alignment, etc. changes.

Additional possibilities (Optional)

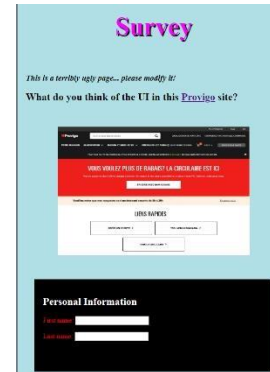
- Allow the user to zoom in on part of the image.
 - Use a photo gallery to show multiple pages of the site.
 - Ask questions related to various images (various parts of a site)
 - Use an image in the background to make the site prettier.
 - Add any other HTML/CSS elements to improve the rendering of your survey and make people want to do it.
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WARNING: You create a static site, the "submit" button does nothing. We will use Javascript from next week to get dynamic websites.
